




Experts believe a cure for DIPG may lead to: THE HOME RUN CURE FOR ALL CANCERS.

Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine Glioma (DIPG) is a type of brain tumor found in the pons, which is part of the brainstem. The name describes how the tumor grows, where it is found, and what kinds of cells give rise to the tumor.

DIPG primarily affects children.
